






# Year on year growth in users 53% in 2021

Since launch in March 2018 the number of site users has increased year on year with the largest growth coming in the last 12 months, as the news travels and service goes 'multi-platform'.

"Dementia Researcher has provided a real community that I feel supports people like me, and service that really cares about its members - a place of civility, friendship and support"



# Membership Growth 40%

The website has over 2,590 registered members, from more than 35 countries. They have access to all content, and receive a weekly news bulletin with articles, events, jobs, funding.

"Dementia Researcher is one of the few websites I come back to time and time again. Every week when the Friday bulletin arrives, there is always something that catches my eye. A podcast topic, an interesting blog, a piece of news, job or funding call. I applied for a grant I spotted advertised on the website in early 2020 and I am pleased to say I was awarded the funding a few months ago - I doubt I would have know about it if it wasn't for the newsletter"



# Diversity 350 Contributors

Contributors report that this helps raise their own profile, contributes to raising awareness of their work & helps others. This is a unique service that brings together ECRs from all areas of discovery + growing by around 10 each month.

"I'm sure I won't even remember all the ways it has helped. From being able to bounce research ideas off people, finding peer support, ideas for different technology/tools that can make life easier, advice when I was having an issue with my institution, career development advice and opportunities, info on funding calls & learning about dementia from different viewpoints than my own discipline & networking with people I would never have met otherwise... it's all been amazing! I now have a charity in a different country interested in collaborating with rolling out my intervention, after hearing me discuss on Dementia Research - this has added so much to my PhD and it's an opportunity I never would have had without Dementia Researcher."





# Delivering for & with partners 5 Year plan



Inspire International Community Experts

Promoting dementia research careers across all areas of discovery, with a particular emphasis on people from under-represented backgrounds. Through visual imagery, stories, blogs, webinars, podcasts, films and improved connections with educational institutions.

Increase contributions from the wider international community. To ensure that ECRs relate to the messages, the people they see and the contributions they make. This will extend to blogs, webinars, events, job listings and funding calls + encourage cross Atlantic relations.

Increase opportunities for face to face and online interactions between researchers.
Establish supportive groups to foster collaborations, improve connections between research fields and to provide peer-to-peer careers guidance.

Ask an expert, working with experts and leaders to share their insights and to work towards improving research culture and sharing of technical expertise, from exploring research methods, to practical how-to guides on everything from lab techniques to interviewing.
